

Crossroads Fellowship Christian Reformed Church Expectations and Behavioral Procedures for Children and Youth

"Train up a child in the way he should go; and even when he is old, he will not depart from it."

(Proverbs 22:6)

PURPOSE: To provide a set of guidelines and spiritual foundation upon which children, youth and adults can build a lasting relationship with Jesus, and to develop disciples for Christ within an environment built on love, encouragement and support.

EXPECTATIONS:

- 1) <u>RESPECT FOR SELF:</u> make good decisions; speak and act appropriately; follow instructions and rules; participate.
- 2) <u>RESPECT FOR OTHERS</u>: keep your hands and feet to yourself; use good manners and appropriate language; respect others personal space; respect the teacher or speaker.
- 3) <u>RESPECT FOR LEARNING</u>: respect what others say and do; be a good listener; pay attention; sit appropriately with your group.
- 4) <u>RESPECT FOR PROPERTY</u>: respect church property and equipment; keep it clean; place litter in garbage; replace the things you use.

BEHAVIOR STANDARDS AND PROCEDURES:

Student behavior is initially handled by the teacher, but can be referred to the Education or Awana Coordinator if behavior becomes chronic.

Standards:

- 1. Students will refrain from cell phone usage during class times. A teacher has the right to confiscate a student's phone during class time, if deemed necessary. Phones will be returned at the end of class time.
- 2. Students will demonstrate acceptable behavior, offering cooperation to teachers, acceptance of classmates, respect for church property and appropriate reverence to God.
- 3. Students will refrain from throwing balls against the windows, each other and hanging on the basketball hoops.

Procedures:

- 1. Corporal punishment is not permitted (spanking, pinching, hitting or abusive verbal discipline).
- 2. Students will be addressed respectfully by the teacher, in a private conversation, when possible, to describe the observed behavior and to explain the appropriate behavior expected in the future.
- 3. Parents or guardians will be informed whenever a child or youth misbehaves beyond minor correction or if a pattern of misbehavior develops.

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- 4. A parent or guardian may be asked to sit in a classroom where misbehavior is an ongoing problem.
- 5. If necessary, a meeting will be held with the student, parents or guardians, the teacher and program coordinator to ensure behavioral improvements.
- 6. A student may be removed from the classroom at any time, if the student's behavior is threatening to the welfare of others (physically, relationally or emotionally). Re-entry will require a meeting between the student, parents or guardians, the teacher and program coordinator.

EXPECTIONS AND PROCEDURES APPLY TO:

Sunday School: 3 years to 12th grade

Early Teens: grades 6 – 8
Youth Group: grades 9 – 12

• AWANA: grades K-5
